Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, as predicted, the weather took up again for harvest work, and great progress was made in cutting and removing such fields of wheat as remained under the long continued rains. An unfavourable change set in yesterday, and last evening the clouds discharged copious showers, so that great apprehension is felt, for another week of rain would be decisive of general failure in the crops.

A poor woman, named Mary Murphy, was killed, on Monday morning, by the falling of an old house in Crosby-row. Shortly after the accident occurred her body was found amongst the ruins, and presented an awful spectacle; the abdomen was burst open, part of the intestines exposed, the left thigh broken, and the countenance also very much disfigured. An inquest was held by the Mayor, at the Exchange, at two o'clock same afternoon, when it appeared from the evidence of John Connell, a labourer, that Mary Murphy resided in the delapidated building for some time, and was latterly in a bad state of health; he apprehended the falling in of the house, and frequently noticed her and four other persons, who occupied apartments in it, to leave it, but they would not do so. On Monday morning he went to work at six o'clock, (being engaged in taking down two condemned houses adjoining) when he observed some mortar fall from near a chimney of the house, and remarked to the other workmen that it was tumbling, soon after which down the house came. The persons who occupied the back rooms fortunately made their escape, but deceased being in a weakly state was unable to get out before the front floors gave way, which buried her beneath them. The Jury returned a verdict of "accidental death," after which Mr. Bernard O'Farrell, Architect, came forward to assure the Mayor that he told the person engaged in taking down the adjoining houses, that if he persevered the consequences would be fatal to human life, and he believed the woman's death was caused by the negligence or incompetency of that person to superintend the work, as the wall of the house that fell had been undermined in taking down the other premises.

On Friday night last, a party of ruffians came to Mr. De Courcy's cottage, at Glenstall, in this County, for the purpose of assassinating his care-taker, who, luckily at the time, happened to be out about his master's business—on ascertaining which they decamped, leaving strict orders for him to quit, a mandate which will be obeyed only so far as it deserves.
