SIR—I feel proud, on my part, to have buried in oblivion, in the eyes of the Limerick inhabitants, whose esteem I value so much, all the charges that the Boys brought against me. As to those of the man who calls himself Jeremiah Godfrey (a name I never heard of before to my recollection, until spoken of by Mr. John Boyse, jun.) I don't think worth my while to reply to him; for, by the tenor of his letter in your publication of Wednesday last, he shows himself beneath my serious notice. If even what he says were true, why did he not punish me, when he asserts I was in his power, since he is so vindictive as to speak of it now, even though the Press, after over eight years! (for that is the time I was living with the Rev. Mr. Elliott) especially after my having, as he says, "begged his pardon on my bended knees." Noble and delicate feelings! And what would that have to do with the late outrage? I have done with Mister Jeremiah Godfrey. What a prophet of peace he is!—what a true follower of his namesake of old! to come out now, and prophesy his own downfall, nearly nine years after it never happened!

All I can say is, that I defy any respectable person, who has a character to preserve, to come forward and to swear on his or her oath that I ever offered the slightest offence to any one, though I have lived ten years in this City, before I unfortunately met that ***** and that I was ever seen, even with the slightest sign of drink on me. Even the Lady with whom I live those five years was prepared, if his trial went on, to bear witness that she never saw me under the influence of drink; and if she did not, after having lived so long with her, who could?
