Quantity of Grain shipped from Limerick, since 1st. September last:—Nineteen thousand two hundred and eighty-three barrels of Wheat; one thousand two hundred and fifty-seven barrels of Barley; sixty-eight thousand and thirty-eight barrels of Oats; besides seven thousand two hundred and fifteen sacks of Flour.

The potato crop almost in every part of the country affords a full average return to the farmer, and in some places the produce is abundant.

Yesterday and this day, over two hundred head of fat cattle were killed for Mr. William Dunbar, at Russell's slaughter house, in St. Francis' Abbey. We are very happy to find that success already attends the spirited effort to revive so important a branch of the provision trade in this city, and many of the graziers in this county and Clare, will now meet near home, as good a market for their beasts as Cork, without the expense, delay, and loss of weight sustained in travelling so many miles to a distant market.

A Government circular has been forwarded to all the prisons in Ireland for a return of the several officers on the staff of each establishment, their names, age, and period of service, with a view, it is supposed, to the consolidation of the gaol system in cities, towns, and counties, and to place on super-annuated allowance many of the present officers, whose services will then be dispensed with.
