Sunday evening last a band of armed men assailed the habitation of a respectable farmer named William-son, at Tory-hill in this county, and inflicted on him very severe bodily punishment. They also fired at and desperately wounded an unoffending pedlar, who happened to be the sojourner of a day in the house of Williamson. He is reported to be dead. This is the third outrage upon life and property by armed gangs in different parts of this county since Christmas.

Rathkeale Sessions commenced on Saturday, at 10 o'clock, before M. Fallon, Esq. Assistant-Barrister.
