 At Belmont, Cork, the residence of his son-in-law, R. W.
 Harris, Esq. Mrs. Connell, relict of the late Anthony Connell,
 Esq. Barrister-at-law.
 At Kilmush, on Sunday, Mr. Edmond Mahony, aged 80, a
 respectable, intelligent man, who amassed a considerable property
 by honest and useful pursuits. His loss is deeply regretted by
 the poor of Kilmush, to whom he was a constant benefactor; he
 remembered that thriving and important town to consist of a few
 cabins, chiefly tenanted by fishermen, and without any prospect
 tive indication of its ever arriving at its present enviable position.
 Saturday morning, at his residence, George's-quay, in advanced
 age, the Very Rev. Charles Hanrahan, P.P. of St. Mary's, and Roman
 Catholic Dean of Limerick—a Clergyman of a truly christian and
 tolerant spirit, distinguished for his chaste eloquence in the pulpit,
 and high classical attainments. He was many years President of
 the Roman Catholic College, at Park, founded by his patron and
 predecessor, the late Rt. Rev. Dr. Young. His remains were
 interred in St. Mary's Chapel.

 T. Baylee, Esq. and sister of the Rev. Joseph Baylee. From a
 very early age it was her unceasing effort to "walk worthy of the
 Lord unto all pleasing;" gifted with uncommon endowments of

 all to HIM who had washed her from her sins in his own blood,
 and by his spirit had made her "meet for the inheritance of the
 Saints in light." During a protracted illness she manifested a
 faith, and patience, and joy, and love, which were most edifying

 dying scene was a beautiful exhibition of a joyful anticipation of
 meeting that Saviour whom she loved and served. As a relative,
 a friend, and a christian, she will be long remembered, and deeply
 mourned for by a large and sorrowing circle.
