The *Water Witch*, Revenue Cutter, has arrived in the Shannon, with the diving bell apparatus, and is to proceed round to the coast of Malbay, to endeavour to raise the guns, chains, and anchors of the *Martin*, sloop of war, wrecked on that coast about twenty-three years ago. Mr. Deane, the inventor of the diving helmet, attempted this feat in the summer of 1837, but from the unsettled state of the weather, and insufficiency of his assistance, was unable to bring up any of them. There is every reason to hope the present attempt will be attended with success.

Patriek Callaghan, porter in a grocer's shop in Roche's-street, was found at a late hour on Sunday night last, by the watchmen opposite Cornmarket-row, lying on his face, and apparently lifeless. Assistance having been procured, he was conveyed to the watch-house, where they found the man to be quite dead. He had been under the influence of liquor, and it is supposed lay down and died from the effects of intoxication. He was frequently solicited to visit the Rev. James Bridgeman, a workman to Mr. Thomas Collins, of Askeaton, who went to Kilrush in charge of a boat of potatoes to sell for his employer, died suddenly in the boat, at the Sand-dock. An inquest was held by John Lucas, Esq.—verdict, "death by the visitation of God."
