" If any Person shall keep at large any Cur Dog, Mastiff, or Bull Dog, within Fifty Yards of any Public Road or Street, without a Log of Wood of the weight FIVE POUNDS attached to his Neck, such Person, for every such offence, shall forfeit the sum of Ten Shillings, and every Constable may kill such Dog."
