The Mayor has made arrangements for expediting
the conveyance of potatoes to market, which continues
well supplied, though the prices are high, but to
satisfy all doubt or suspicion of undue influence being
used by interested persons to affect the market, the
Mayor also issued a notice to forestallers and regraters
that the full penalty of the law will be inflicted upon all
detected in such dishonest practices. No person will
be allowed to buy up potatoes on the way to town, as
the market must be supplied, and the quantity there
will be found sufficient for all purposes. Potatoes are
coming to market in abundance this week.

The High Sheriff of this County has received an
order from his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, com-
muting the sentence of 7 years transportation at the
last Quarter Sessions, against Daniel O'Dell, for pig
stealing, to two years hard labour, and four days soli-
tary confinement in every alternate month.

Monday night the house of James Fraser, farmer,
at Kilegariffe, Ballylanders, was attacked by an armed
band of ten men, who deprived him of two guns, and
fired a shot on their departure. They next went to
the house of Maurice Condon, in the same neigh-
bourhood, whom they compelled to give them £1
in silver, which they told him he had received the
day before at Kilfinan.

Threatening notices have been served in the neigh-
bourhood of Loughgur, fixing the price of potatoes,
and forbidding sales beyond that rate.

John Lyons, of Cappamore, died yesterday of the
injuries he suffered by the ruinous conflagration of
four houses in that village, as related in our last.

Timothy Hogan, of Herbertstown, was severely
assaulted by a party of men, for demanding what was
thought a high price for potatoes.

The houses of four farmers named Carroll, Magarry,
Bulman, and Irwin, near Croom, are reported to
have been attacked by armed parties and the inmates
beaten.

A care taker named O'Loughlin, in the employ of
Cornelius O'Brien, Esq. M. P. near Ennis, was mal-
treated by a band of ruffians, who ordered him to
quit on pain of death.

A reward of £600 is offered for the armed gang
that fired two shots at the residence of Avary Jordan,
Esq. Race-course, Cashel, and posted a Rock notice
on the gate.
