The London Papers of Thursday, received this forenoon, announce the important fact of Lord Stanley's motion for going into committee having been carried by a majority of *three*, on a division of 301 to 298. The speakers were Mr. Hume, Mr. Lucas, Mr. Redington, Mr. Gaskell, Mr. E. Roche, Mr. Callaghan, Mr. Somers, Sir E. Grey, Mr. Thesiger, Mr. O'Connell, Sir R. Peel, and Lord Morpeth. The House of Commons adjourned at two o'clock, on Thursday morning, with the intention of canvassing the clauses of the bill in committee on Friday. The future success of the measure is a matter of some doubt.

The meeting of Magistrates yesterday week at Pallis Kenry, and the recent outrages in that district, were made the subject of pointed discussion in the House of Lords Tuesday evening. The proceedings are reported in our columns.

This morning, Michael Manogue, a countryman, from Parteen, was killed at the Temporary Bridge, Thomondgate, by a bread cart passing over his body. The accident is attributed to the negligence of the driver. This is the second fatal occurrence of that identical kind there within a year.

A melancholy occurrence took place at Cappamore, on Thursday night. Four houses, the property of Mr. John Crowe, occupied by tenants, were consumed to ashes, and some property also. Unfortunately they were not insured. The fire raged for nearly four hours, and had such an alarming appearance, that the inhabitants of the village were momentarily expecting their houses to meet with the same fate as the others. Chief Constable Brett, and the party of men under his command, were indefatigable in their exertions, and often in danger of their lives. It is not ascertained as yet how the fire originated. One man has been nearly burned to death, and taken to the hospital.

Yesterday, James Tracy, footman of Sir William Leeson, Chamberlain, Dublin Castle, attempted to cut the throat of Susan Lloyd, the housemaid, and so far succeeded in his nefarious purpose, that the unfortunate young woman now lies in a very precarious state in the Meath Hospital. It is said he had been paying addresses to her, and that she refused to marry him, which led to the commission of the act. He is fully committed to Newgate.
