ASSIZES, 13 2700.

The Grand Jury of the County Cork were this day to elect a High Constable and Collector of Kinualmacky barony, at 10d. to the pound. Mr. Hallinan was dismissed for levying more than his warrant authorised.

One of the cases for trial at Cork is a prosecution by Mr. Webb, postmaster, against Mr. Paul Danckert, one of his clerks, for a deficiency of public money caused by one of the assistants in the department.

The Cork Grand Jury present for the salaries of their officers in advance, the legality of which there and in other places is reserved for the 12 Judges. In Cork Judge Perrin has not respited such presentments, though he did so in other places where the practice was prevalent.

The body of Master Thomas Welland, youngest son of the Rev. W. Welland, of Cloyne, was picked up on Friday evening, off Passage, close by an American vessel which was discharging timber.

Lady Palmer's wardrobe at Rush, near Dublin, was rifled of 700 sovereigns, a few days since.

The rye crop in the west of the County of Clare is in a very forward state.

Sixte-four persons were committed to Cork Bridewell on Saturday and Sunday night, charged with various offences ; twenty-three being drunk in the streets.

It is proposed to have the fairs in Ballinasloe hence forward commence on Tuesday, so that all business should be closed within the week. The proposal to the Baron of the fair, we believe Admiral Clancarthy, was signed at the fair of Clonroad, on Saturday.

At Clonroad fair, on Saturday, the price of stock as well as sheep, suffered a considerable reduction. There was but little business transacted. Pigs rated so high as 40s. a cwt. There were a great number of horses exhibited, but of an inferior description.

On Sunday evening last, a young woman at Churchtown, near Newcastle, named Kelly, was attacked with a fit of epilepsy, and dropped dead in less than a minute. Doctor Phayer was promptly in attendance, to apply the usual remedies, but without effect.
