A man of the name of Feheeny, was murdered

The unfortunate man was felled to the earth by a
blow from a spade-tree, which broke his skull, and
he died shortly after. A family of the name of Dris-
coll are in custody of the Police, for this brutal murder.

John Dowling, Esq. Solicitor of Newcastle, accom-
panied by Mr. Downes, Auctioneer, from Rathkeale,
went to the lands of Dolas, near Croom, on Monday,
to dispose of the effects of a man of the name of
Meskill, which were seized under a Sheriff's order.
When they arrived on the ground the country-people
assembled in force and attacked Mr. Dowling in the
most furious manner. He was severely beat
and cut, and the Auctioneer fled for his life.
They fired shots over Mr. Dowling as he lay on the
ground. One of the principals in this outrage, was
dressed in woman's clothes. James D. Lyons, Esq.
and the Police were up at the scene very soon after,
and arrested a man of the name of Cornelius Meskill,
who is identified. Constable Leehy was particularly
active on this occasion.

Monday the Mayor held an inquest at the Fever
Hospital, on the body of Margaret Howley, who it
was reported died of injuries from David Dundon, a
labourer in Pennywell, and to which the witnesses
deposed, but the jury altered their view of the case,
on the evidence of the attending physician, and
returned a verdict of "Died by the visitation of God."
