The Rev. Wm. Downes, P.P. of Patrick's-well, and Ballybrown, returning from the hospitable mansion of the Rev. L. Hartnet, P.P. of Croom, on Friday night last, was thrown from his horse, near Patrick's-well, and lay upon the road with his head fractured, and bleeding for near five hours before he was discovered by some carman on the road, who removed him to a farmer's house in the vicinity, where he remained unconscious of all about him, until death put an end to his sufferings on Monday evening. He was interred this day in the Chapel of Ballybrown, which he had built. The Rev. gentleman was *twice* thrown by the same horse before.
