Christmas. The report is now, that a woman servant
in a gentleman's family in that neighbourhood ca-
sually overheard the details of a plot for the assassi-
nation of that Clergyman, in which one of the men-
servants in the same household, was an accom-
plice, that a letter was prepared by the secret conclave,
and forwarded to the Rev. Mr. Downes, acquaint-
ing him that certain fire-arms would be surren-
dered to him in a private and remote part of
the parish, on the very same night, and where
he was found dead, supposed to be thrown
from his horse, and killed; but as it would seem from
this new version of the tale, he was insidiously
ensnared to the fatal spot, for the purpose of being
murdered by persons whose lawless operations
the Rev. Gentleman had been known to de-
nounce at the altar, on different occasions.—
Lord Clarina and William Monsell, Esq. held a pre-
paratory investigation of the matter yesterday, at
Patrick's-well Petty Sessions, but the woman did not
appear. Meantime, the family of deceased under-
took to make search for the letter sent to the Priest,
and which is charged to have led to the catastrophe.
It is rather extraordinary, that no inquest has been
held in this case.

A young woman of the name of Margaret Minahan
having been found dead by strangulation, on Wed-
nesday, in the bed-room of a farm-house at Lickadoon,
the Mayor repaired to the scene next morning, and
held an inquest upon the body, when the members
of the family deposed that they had missed her about
eight in the evening, and a little sister having gone
to call her, they found the unfortunate girl suspended
by a handkerchief round her neck, from a beam in
the ceiling, and that she was then dead. The Jury
found a verdict that she hung herself in a state of
temporary derangement. It is understood, however,
that an unfortunate attachment and connexion with a
farmer's boy in the neighbourhood, impelled the dis-
traced girl to this awful extremity.

Advices received at our office, this week, from New
York, illustrate the privations which Irish emigrants
endure, who remain in that capital after landing, with-
out provision or means to pursue their route to the
interior, where profitable employment may be had.
Some hundreds, by the last accounts, had suffered
much there in consequence.
