The Railway system is to be taken up, as we recommended, at the Commercial Buildings, Dublin, where the Duke of Leinster and Mr. O'Connell moved the Government plan, "Private enterprise aided by the State." The Southern will be the line, so as to diverge to Limerick; the money to be advanced by Baring and others, guaranteed 4 per cent. by Government, the surplus profits to go to further extensions. The county of Tipperary is in a most appalling state of moral disorganization, and such butchery of human life no other district in Ireland presents at this moment. Two men were murdered on Good Friday, and another murder on Easter Sunday is reported. An extraordinary military force has been ordered into the disturbed district.

On Good Friday two men named Thady Tierney and John Gleeson, were murdered at Curramore, Kilbarron, Tipperary.

A man named Patt Hayes, who lived near the river Shannon, within a mile of the Very Rev. Dean Holemes' lodge, was brutally murdered on the night of Monday.

On the night of Thursday a shot was fired into the dwelling of John Diffely, of Clooncarne, Mohill, by which two of his daughters were wounded.

James Sharp, late of this city, Esq. merchant, was drowned at Rothsay, on Tuesday se'nnight, when stepping from a Glasgow steamer. He was brother to John Sharp, Esq. of this City.

A cargo of wheat and flour was *imported* here yesterday from London! This is a novel feature in our commerce.

We this day give an "epitome" of Capt. Mudge's report, referred to by Mr. Dickson's letter, published by us, a few posts back.
