Until age and ill health undermined his constitution, the Rev. Gentleman continued a steadfast labourer in the Lord's vineyard, but now the "good and faithful servant" is gone to receive his reward. The mortal remains of the Rev. John Duddle were interred this morning at St. Munchin's Church, attended by a great number of the Clergy of the diocese, and by a numerous cortege of respectable citizens.
