Practical and Descriptive Anatomy, by Dr. HARGREVE, Dr. HART, Dr. WILMOT, Mr. PORTER. Surgery, by Dr. BLNSON, Dr. EVANSON. Practice of Medicine, by Dr. APJOHN. Chemistry, by Mr. WILLIAM. Materia Medica, by Dr. MAUNSE. Midwifery, and Diseases of Women and Children, by Dr. GEORGE. Medical Jurisprudence, by Dr. GEORGE.
