This excellent Lady has left an example to her children of the blessed effects of a Christian life, devoted in every instance to the improvement and happiness of her fellow-beings—to the extension of religion and charity, as well in the higher circles, which she has graced with her presence, as in the lowly and humble sphere, which she often sought to comfort the afflicted, and relieve the destitute. The remains of Mrs. Maunsell will be interred in the family vault at St. John's Church.
