Sydney, Hobart Town, and Port Phillip, arrived at the LIMERICK CHRONICLE on the 5th of August:—Col. At Newcastle Petty Sessions informations were ordered against Mary Dore and James Riordan for rescuing two cows seized under a civil Bill decree, by Timothy Crowley; and against Garrett Kelly, Daniel, John and Mary Kenny, for rescuing cattle distrained for poor-rates, by James Riedy, Collector; Patrick Bray was convicted in a penalty of £5, or four months imprisonment with hard labour, for entering on the lands of Farren, and cutting and carrying away a quantity of hazel rods, the property of John Massy, Esq. of Glenville.

A situation of great emolument has just been conferred upon an ex M.P. of an adjoining county, by the present Government.

George A. Pollock, Esq. Clerk of the Peace for Dublin, met a serious accident while fowling at his father's seat, in Meath, where one of the party missing a woodcock, lodged 36 grains of shot in Mr. Pollock's leg.

Number of drunkards committed to the city gaol for the year ending 31st December last, 450; being a small increase over last year. Summary convictions 256; being an increase of 88 when compared with that of the year ending 1840.
