The Divisional Magistrates of Dublin have met to memorial Government for an increase of salary, under the new Police act.

The Court of Inquiry at the Police Office upon the conduct of M. O'Malley Burke, Esq. Sub-Inspector, Cappamore, closed yesterday, after that officer had read a written defence, and the evidence was transmitted to Colonel M'Gregor, Inspector-General, by Messrs. Percy and Plunkett, County Inspectors, presiding. The charges comprised absence from duty, and non-payment of money to one of the force under his command.

Yesterday, between three and four in the afternoon, one of that abject and depraved class of women who walk the streets in pursuit of infamy and vice, stopped before the attractive shop window of Mr. R. Wallace, jeweller, George's-street, and with a stone in her hand, dashed in a square of plate glass, value £10, perfectly reckless of the consequences to herself or others. She never attempted to escape, and was made a prisoner on the spot. A more wanton and atrocious outrage than this could scarce be perpetrated, to the injury of a respectable and industrious trader, and we have to regret how frequent this crime has become of late. The name of the wretch is Eilen Sullivan.

Mr. Philip Carroll, cook at the Club-house, and who had actively assisted in the *cuisine* department for the late grand Ball, having died rather suddenly on Thursday evening, Aldermen Watson and Crips held an inquest yesterday, when the verdict was death from apoplexy, induced, it is believed, by fright at seeing a friend of his robbed to the very apparel he wore, after being to a house of ill fame in the Old Town.
