Monday the Under Sheriff of Waterford, Edward
T. Foley, Esq., proceeded to Clonmoyle, near
Carrick-on-Suir, for the purpose of dispossessing a
farmer named Michael Cantwell, under a *habere*.
The Sheriff was accompanied by the Constabulary of
that neighbourhood, and by the Military of the 46th
Depot, at Carrick-on-suir, as it was known that pre-
paration was made to oppose the taking possession.
After the sheriff and his assistants had broke open the
door, their entrance was forcibly resisted by Cant-
well and his party, and in the conflict Cantwell was
stabbed in the breast by one of the Constabulary,
