siastically responded by the immense crowds on the quays, and which they greatfully acknowledged, both the noble Marquis and his amiable Lady repeatedly smiling at the warmth of the Irish cead mille a falthaugh they received. The Marchioness was rather plainly attired; she wore a striped lilac muslin robe. white satin bonnet, and crimson travelling shawl. After leaving the steamer, the happy couple drove off in their carriage to the magnificent residence of the Beres'ord family at Curraghmore. The Marquess and Marchioness of Waterford are expected to honour Killarney races with their presence. On Sunday last, a smith of the name of Fox was killed by the lightning at Knockfierna, in this county, during the thunder, another man met the like fate near Ballingarry, and another at Charlevile A fine colt, the property of Godfrey Ball, Esq. of Ballinakill, was killed by the electric fluid. Rich. Newcombe Willis, Esq. who in the early part of the present year graduated in Trinity College, Dublin, and took out his medical degree in the same Universito, was, on Monday, the 6th instant, admitted a member of the Royal College of Surgeons, London, having gone through the several studies, and passed the required examination. Doctor Willis is fourth son of the late Rev. Thomas G Willis, L.L.D. Rector of the Union of Kilmurry and Derrygalvin, in this diocese. Mr. Duffy, Proprietor of the Belfast Vindicator, is found guilty in the Court of Queen's Bench, of a malicious and seditious libel, relating to the trial and conviction of Francis Hughes, for murder, at Armagh Assizes, reflecting upon the Jury, and the prosecution.
