As Mr. Fetherston was returning from Hogan's, the scene of the foregoing outrage, on same day he espied a man named Delahunt who has been on the run in Tipperary, since the 2d May last, charged by a coroner's jury with the murder of his brother-in-law. Mr. Fetherston, single-handed, succeeded in arresting Delahunt, and after a march of three miles, safely lodged him in the Police barrack, at Bruree. Constable Graham proceeded at night to the red hill above Coolrus, and succeeded in capturing four men of notorious bad character, on strong suspicion of being the remainder of the party.

Two guns were forcibly taken by an armed party from the Steward of William Cannon, Esq. Kildysart, a few nights since.

Michael Mara, servant to Mr. O'Callaghan, Wine-merchant, George-street, was apprehended yesterday by that indefatigable thief-catcher, Sergeant Reidy. It appears that Mr. O'Callaghan missed sums of money from time to time during the last 3 months amounting to 60 or 70 pounds. Suspicions at length rested upon Mara, which were communicated to Sergeant Riedy, and that invaluable officer with his usual adroitness and skill discovered that he was the thief. By a subsequent admission of the prisoner, it appeared that he acknowledged to the robbery of £10; further search was made, when it was found that £14 10s. was lodged to his credit in the savings bank, besides £3 10s. got in his box, and other sums disposed of in various ways. He is fully committed for trial.

Yesterday, a dreadful accident occurred at Harvey's quay, in this city. Several labourers were engaged at the unloading of an American timber vessel, and while a large beam was being raised to the top of a crane, the groove irons suddenly gave way, and a man named Edward Merrit, who stood at the end directing its course, was crushed to death on the spot. Every assistance was immediately rendered, but in vain, for life had become instantly extinct.

A deplorable accident has occurred in Killaloe, during the excavations in the river near the bridge, by the Shannon Improvement Commissioners, when blasting the rocky strata of the late eel weirs. An explosion took place, and a stone block of near half a cwt. weight was blown into the air, which falling over a cabin, brought down the roof, and killed a fine young woman named Margaret Ellis, then in bed, to the utter astonishment and horror of the family.

Monday last being Lady Day in harvest, the streets were filled with the largest concourse of persons, especially country people, ever seen in town upon a holiday.
