Mr. D. J. Murphy, a distinguished public writer, by whom a Cork Newspaper was established, and who has been engaged in literary pursuits for many years in London, has published a small pamphlet, detailing his discovery and plan for the speedy and effectual extinguishing of fires in her Majesty's dock-yards and arsenals, as well as in manufactories, private dwelling houses, and all other buildings. At the suggestion of the Premier, to whom the discovery was just made known, Mr. Murphy submitted his plan to the Lords of the Admiralty; and as the pamphlet contains the correspondence of the author with Sir Robert Peel, and their Lordships, these interesting epistles, with other valuable extracts, should appear in this impression if we were not crowded with previous matter; but as the subject is of great importance to the public service, as well as to the nation in general, and as it is likely to attract the attention of the Insurance Companies, who will, in all probability, have it tested by men of science; and moreover as it is even likely to engage the consideration of the legislature, we shall at a convenient period return to the subject.
