DEATH OF R. OLIVER GASCOIGNE, ESQ JUN.

The sudden and lamented death of this esteemed and excellent gentleman in the prime of life, and in the 36th year of his age, took place at Weymouth, on Christmas Eve, when melancholy to relate, he retired to his bed in his ordinary health and was found a corpse in the morning. As this much to be deplored intelligence reached Mr. William Oliver, the agent of the extensive estates of the family, on Sunday last, at Kilfinane, no language could describe the deep sorrow and poignant regret with which this, to them, calamitous visitation was heard by the numerous tenantry of the estates, which were for the first time visited within a few short months by this lamented gentleman, when he was called away by urgent business to England, but for the short period he sojourned among them, he evinced the most anxious solicitude to relieve the wants and increase the comforts of the widow and orphan, and of every individual on his father's estates, and frequently expressed his regret that he had not sooner come over to Ireland, but that he should hope to visit this country often, as he was acquainted with his tenantry, and convinced of the good wishes and gratitude of the people.
