DEATH OF R. OLIVER GASCOIGNE, ESQ JUN.

The sudden and lamented death of this esteemed and excellent gentleman in the prime of life, and in the 36th year of his age, took place at Weymouth. on Christmas Eve, when melancholy to relate, he retired to his bed in his ordinary health and was found a corpse in the morning.
