

Obtained a verdict of 50l. damages against Sir E. R. Borough, High Sheriff of Dublin, for false arrest and imprisonment of two hours. Plaintiff was mistaken for his brother.

As Adjutant Jones, of the 37th Regt. was riding through Fitzwilliam-st. Dublin, yesterday evening, his horse took fright and threw him, and his head coming with great violence against the ground, he received a very severe wound.

Major Saville Broom, 10th Regt. died at Fort William, Calcutta, on the 16th December last.

The murder of Lt.-Col. Stoddart and Capt. Conolly, in Bokhara, the capital of Asiatic Turkey, is confirmed. Both were decapitated.

The report in the *Globe* newspaper, of the officers of the 17th Lancers having committed a cruel outrage on a female at Leeds, is contradicted by Lt.-Col. St. Quintin, who pronounces it a false and scandalous libel on the Regt.

Constable Shanahan and party of Kilcommon, arrested the notorious John Ryan, *adderee*, of Cunneeny, charged with being of an armed party that, on the night of the 5th inst., attacked and fired several shots into the house of Philip Fahy of Clonoulty, county of Tipperary.
