A few officers of the 60th Rifle Depot at Newry,
were fined by the Magistrates on Thursday morning,
for window breaking and knocker-wrenching the

Lieutenant George A. F. Ruxton of the 89th,

At the inquest on Thursday, on the body of Mr.
James M'Dermott, Wm. Flannery deposed, he was
speaking to Mr. M'Dermott, on Wednesday, and that
he appeared in his usual health; saw him on the
Canal bridge, ten minutes before he got ill; deceased
became quite weak, and lost his colour. Dr. Kidd
was the first medical gentleman on the spot, in an-
swer to whom witness said, Mr. M'Dermott had no
frothing at the mouth, or stertorous breathing;
breathed quite easily once or twice, and never
revived. Dr. Kidd examined—Was called to see Mr.
M'Dermott between one and two o'clock; when he
reached the house Mr. M'Dermott was lifeless, and
rapidly growing cold; was evidently dead for some
minutes; is of opinion death was caused by either
rupture of the heart, or some of the larger blood-
vessels; simple apoplexy would not have killed him
so rapidly, except it occurred in one particular part
of the brain; from the absence of stertor, is quite
satisfied some of the larger vessels, or the heart,
gave way. The Jury returned a verdict—"Died by
the visitation of God."
