

Lord Clarina and family have arrived at Elm-Park, from Dublin.

SUDDEN DEATH.—We regret to record an instance of the fatal results of intemperance, which occurred in Cornwallis-street, in this city, on Sunday morning. A young man named James Farrell, a reputed *pledge breaker*, in company with James Hanrahan, and Myles Molony, went on what is termed "a reel of drinking," and after gratifying themselves in several public houses, were returning home about one o'clock, greatly intoxicated; on passing through Broad street, Farrell fell, but was taken up immediately by the watchmen, and carried to his house, where he was seized with a fit of apoplexy and died in three minutes! Same day James L. Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest on the body, when the following verdict was returned—"We find that the said James Farrell died from an attack of apoplexy or rupture of the blood vessels of his brain, early on the morning of the 2d day of July inst, at his house in Cornwallis-street, and that said attack was brought on by his having drank to excess of ardent spirits."
