Thus are the claims of this admirable Society continually proved, by constantly recurring facts, to be equally urgent on the benevolent of every class in the community, from the gallant soldier to the humblest civilian—from the enlightened supporter of scriptural education to the earnest advocate for the extension of divine revelation to the remotest parts of the kingdom. We feel assured that the public only require to be informed that an increase of funds is needful, to secure an exhibition of that generous benevolence which has been often exercised in behalf of this equally useful, interesting, and popular institution.

Doctor Drew that the interior of his Church should be repaired. He had been applying on the subject for the last five years to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners without effect.
