Great progress has been made in harvest work this week, with such glorious summer weather, and the corn sickle has now generally supplanted the hay scythe.

A bill is to be brought in next session by the Lord Chancellor, to arrange the important question of Presbyterian marriages. It recognises the right of the clergy to marry members of their communion to episcopalians. There is to be a publication of bans, as in the Established church, the ceremony is to be performed in the meeting house within canonical hours, and a registry to be kept.

On Wednesday evening, an occurrence almost fatal in its consequences, took place in Little Denmark-street. It appears that a man named James Regan, a witness in a case of outrage to be tried at the adjourned assizes next month, was lodging in a house in that street, and in the evening attempted to take some unbecoming liberties with a young woman named Sullivan, also a lodger in the same house. A brother of the woman, aged about 12, being present, interposed, and in a determined tone ordered Regan to desist, whereupon the fellow took a pistol from his pocket and fired, lodging its contents (two small balls) in the boy's body. The sufferer was at once taken to a surgeon, who extricated the balls, but he still lies in a dangerous condition. On the following day Sir Richard Franklin committed the brutal perpetrator to prison.

On Thursday, while a young lad named Denis Hainan, was playing with others at the rere of the County Gaol, he accidentally fell into a quarry, at the bottom of which there was a considerable lodgment of water. He struggled for some time, his associates from the depth of the pit being unable to render him any assistance, until at length men, attracted by the cries, arrived at the spot and took him up quite exhausted and nearly lifeless. He was conveyed to the County Infirmary where every restorative was tried by Dr. Thwaites but in vain, as the little fellow survived but a few minutes.
