Friday morning the farm house and out-offices of

 sustained is estimated at £600.

On Monday last two women had an altercation near  
 Ballyseedy, in this county, when one of them named  
 Mary Hourigan, received a blow on the head. She  
 was immediately conveyed to the County Infirmary,  
 where she lies in a very dangerous state.

At Pallas Kenry Petty Sessions, Patrick Murphy,  
 for being drunk, riotous, and obstructing the police,  
 was fined £1 or one month's imprisonment at hard  
 labour; five others 10s. or one fortnight at hard  
 labour, for being drunk and fighting, and three more  
 same offence, 5s. or 48 hours imprisonment.
