On Sunday last, three fellows entered the house of a man of the name of Thomas Cormick, in the parish of Kilcommon and County of Tipperary, while the family were at Chapel, and took away by force, an excellent gun, but on the peasantry being apprized of the circumstance they instantly left the Chapel without waiting for the service to be over, pursued the offenders, and after a brisk chase of several miles succeeded in capturing them, when they delivered them up bound hand and foot to the police, who lodged them the same night in the barrack at Kilcommon, from whence they were removed next day to the bridewell of Newport.

On Monday evening John Dwyer, identified as one of the party charged with violently assaulting Johnson, sheriff's bailiff, and his assistant, in May last, near Murroe, was arrested at Annagh, in this county, by Constable Philips, and a party under his command.

On Thursday last, a man named John Bourke, working in a quarry, and having his left arm extended, a stone block supposed to weigh near three tons, and of a wedge shape, fell from a height of about nine feet upon his extended arm, which it almost completely severed from his body, being left attached by a small portion of flesh only. What makes this more remarkable is, the fact of the poor sufferer, as soon as he recovered from the immediate effects of the injury, having taken up the severed limb and brought it to his own residence. He was conveyed to the County Infirmary, and favourable hopes are entertained of his recovery.

On Thursday, a young girl from Ballingarry, was passing under a corn store in Roche's-street, when a heavy bag (which was in the act of being lowered from the top of the store) fell on her, and inflicted a very severe compound fracture of her left leg, and a fracture of her right thigh. The poor sufferer was immediately conveyed to the County Infirmary, where she is now going on rather favourably.

On Monday evening a young man named John Kennedy, a native of the County Clare, was drowned while bathing at a place called Hewitt's Ferry, in the river Shannon, near Corbally.

On Thursday last a poor labourer named Daniel Madden, standing behind another man who was reaping corn, the point of the reaping hook accidentally entered his eye, and the result it is feared will be the loss of vision.
