The offender was met by Serjeant Riedy near the Commercial Buildings same evening, who immediately arrested him, found £6 in his possession, and discovered where he had deposited £4 5s. 11d. in his lodging house.

On Wednesday night, as a poor man of the name of Fitzgerald, from the neighbourhood of Shanagolden, was returning from Cork, he had to pass through the village of Knockaderry, and at the other side of this there is a large hill, which was ordered to be cut away, and for which there was a presentment some years ago, but which was never finished. The passage through this part of the road scarcely admits a single car, and on each side are large holes, some of them of the depth of 8 feet, where stones had been raised. This poor man not being acquainted with this dangerous locality, with his horse and cart, fell into one of these holes, and he was killed on the spot! He has left a wife and 7 children to deplore his untimely loss. The proper officer should see to this treacherous pass, and have it put in repair, else similar fatal accidents to this truly melancholy one, may be apprehended.

Friday morning, four men from the neighbourhood of Enniscrone, Mayo, put off in a boat for the purpose of hauling in some nets which they had set for taking herrings. When at a short distance from the shore, the sea rose suddenly to a tremendous height and upset the boat, when three of the men were unfortunately lost.
