## THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

The Irish Arms Act is appointed by the Lord Lieutenant in Council, to come into operation on Monday next. It contains sixty-four sections, with a schedule or forms annexed, giving information respecting the registration of arms, the importation, manufacture, and sale of arms, gunpowder and ammunition. Government has determined that all arms shall be branded, in conformity with the provisions of the Arms' Act, by the Constabulary, which will prevent persons having arms being put to expense. Policemen of each station are to go to Dublin, to be instructed in the method of marking.

The Earl of Limerick's family are again placed in mourning by the death of another of his Lordship's grandsons, the Hon. Frederick Henry Pery, Lieut. in the second European Regiment of Bengal Infantry, at Meerut, of spasmodic cholera. The present Lord Glentworth, heir apparent to his grandfather, the Earl of Limerick, continues to labour under a malady, which is feared to be incurable. His Lordship is married, but has no issue, and his only surviving brother, the Hon. William H. Tennison Pery, is in the Post-office department at New South Wales, from whence he is expected in England early next year.

The Earl of Dunraven is about to make a liberal reduction in the rents of his tenantry in Glamorgan-shire. The Noble Earl has, with the greatest consideration, made an abatement of twenty per cent. on the rents arising from his estates in the county Limerick.
