Royal Dublin Society.—Vice-Presidents elected on Thursday :—Lords Downshire, Ormond, Clancarty, Judge Jackson, Sir Robert Shaw, Sir W. Betham, and Henry Kemmis, Esq. The new Museum, on which upwards of £3000 has been expended, will shortly be opened. The new Conservatory at the Botanic Garden is in progress. The sum of £20 was voted to be placed at the disposal of Jef. Kingsley, Esq. to illustrate curve lines in the prints of philosophical or of statistical tables. Messrs. Mat. Dease, Phil. Reade, and John Kirwan, are proposed as members at next meeting, on 9th December.

On the morning of the 17th inst. an illicit glass manufactory, on an extensive scale, was discovered in Waterford, through the vigilance of Messrs. Blair (son to the Pro-Collector of this city) Strang, Pugh and Andrews, officers of excise. After considerable difficulty an entrance was effected, when they found, artfully constructed, a furnace, with large crucibles for melting and preparing the metal, together with all other implements necessary for the manufactory of flint glass. The manufacturer, who was at work, was taken prisoner, and brought before the Mayor of Waterford, convicted in the penalty of £30, and in default of payment committed to the House of Correction for three months, under the statute for such offence. All the implements, with a quantity of manufactured glass, were removed, and deposited in the seizure store at Waterford. Too much praise cannot be given to these officers in having, by their exertions, put a stop to a concern fraudulent to the revenue, and injurious to the fair trader.
