On Friday morning, Michael Burke White, Esq. formerly of Craggs, in this county, and brother-in-law of the late Colonel Knight, was found dead at his lodgings in Dominick-street, Dublin, after having repaired to bed the previous night in good health. The servant going to his room, observed him on his back with his clothes on, but quite dead. Mr. Hyndham held an inquest on the body, and the jury returned a verdict, "that he died from an apoplectic fit." Mr. White's life was insured for a large sum.

The grand Masonic ball and supper at Ennis, on Friday night, was attended by 160 of the gentry of town and neighbourhood. The orchestre of the ball-room was occupied by the band of the 82d, and a quadrille band. An excellent portrait of the Provincial Grand Master of North Munster, Michael Furnell, Esq. D.L. in full costume, was placed over the Lodge room. William Arthur, Esq. Master of 60, presided at the supper table. Sir Lucius O'Brien, Bart. Lord Lieutenant of the county, whose father and grandfather were Masons, joined in the festivities.

On Saturday the Earl of Roden and a party of friends, accompanied by Sir John M'Neil, visited Drogheda, by railway. On Sunday, the Earl of Charlemont arrived in the town by railway, and proceeded to inspect the battle field of the Boyne.

The Rev. S. Jones, Rector of Middleton, presided at a public meeting there on Monday, to protest against excessive rate of 2s in the pound or ten per cent, declared by the guardians of the union, the payment of which is affirmed to be entirely out of the ability of the inhabitants to discharge. The meeting resolved to petition Parliament for redress.
