Mr. Carmody, keeper of the Barracks, for detaining his property. It appeared that the complainant went into the barrack for the purpose of making sale of articles to the soldiers, similar to those sold at the canteen, in consequence of which Mr. Carmody detained the basket in which the goods were. Serjeant Major Morris, of the 30th, proved it was contrary to regulations that any one should sell articles in the barrack, which could be had at the canteen, without an order from the Commanding officer, whose duty it was to protect the interests of the proprietor. Mr. Carmody was ordered to return Ayward the basket, and the case was dismissed.

The Lord Mayor of Dublin, by proclamation was required, under a penalty that all owners of dogs, within the metropolis shall have on them, when at large, either muzzles or logs; and as it is the practice to permit dogs to be at large with small pieces of wood attached to their necks, the commissioners direct that in every case in which the wood used shall not be what may be properly called a log of wood, the owner of the dog shall be summoned.
