MURDER OF ARTHUR GLOSTER, ESQ.

A meeting of the neighbouring magistrates took place at the Kilkishen station on yesterday, after a post mortem examination of the body by Doctor Frazer, of Tulla. It was supposed that the assassin must have fired within a yard or two of the body from a double barrel gun. Five small balls entered the back, four of which were found. One passing through the body had rested between the skin and shirt; a second went through the heart; the back bone was completely shattered, and two of the balls coming in contact with the bone were quite flat. Several witnesses were ex- amined by the magistrates, but no clue could be had as to the murderer. One woman acknowledged to have heard the shots, but would not admit to have seen any person near the place.
