CLARE AGRICULTURAL IMPROVEMENT SOCIETY.

At a Meeting of the Landed Proprietors and Gentry
of the County of Clare assembled at Ennis Court
House, on SATURDAY, the 7th December, 1844, by
William Butler, Esq. High Sheriff, pursuant to public
invitation, the following Resolutions were proposed by
David J. Wilson, Esq. Belvoir, and unanimously
adopted:—

Resolved—That a Society be now formed to be called
the Clare Agricultural Improvement Society."

Resolved—That its officers shall consist of a Patron,
President, 2 Vice-Presidents, 2 Trustees, a Treasurer,
Honorary Secretary, and a paid Assistant Secretary.

Resolved—That annual subscriptions, and the inter-
est derivable from donations, shall constitute the funds
of the society; and that all subscribers of one pound
or over that sum, who may pay in their subscriptions be-
fore the last day of next spring assizes, shall be consid-
ered as original members of the society.

Resolved—That a committee of five be now named, to
frame rules and regulations for the future government
of the society, and which shall be submitted to a gene-
ral meeting, to be called for the purpose.

Resolved—That our formation and intention to put
ourselves in connection with it, be now communicated
to the Royal Agricultural Improvement Society of
Ireland.

Resolved—That the chief object of this "the County
Agricultural Society" shall be to encourage the formation of
District Societies throughout the county, to afford
them aid and assistance in carrying out an improved
system of cultivation and cropping on small farms, in
housefeeding, in the breeding of cattle suited to the
several localities, and improving the state and domestic
economy of the dwellings of small farmers and laborers.

Resolved—That when our funds admit, it would be
most desirable to establish a model farm in the vicinity
of Ennis; in the meantime we would strongly recom-
mend that proprietors should attach a small portion of
ground to schools of every denomination, where boys
might work for a short period each day, and receive
some instruction in the principles of agriculture.

Resolved—That one General Meeting of the Society
shall take place annually at Ennis, for the exhibition of
the stock, farming Implements, Seed, and all kinds of
agricultural produce. When honorary premiums, and
certificates, will be awarded to Proprietors and holders
of large Farms, it being distinctly understood, that all
money, or Implement premiums, shall be reserved for
the occupiers of Farms under 25 acres Irish.

Resolved—That as carrying out the great objects of
the Society should cordially bring together, men of
every class and every creed, it be a fundamental rule,
that no question of a party, or political tendency, shall
be introduced at any of the meetings of the Society.
