CLARE AGRICULTURAL IMPROVEMENT SOCIETY.

T a Meeting of the Landed Proprietors and Gentry of the county of Clare assembled at Ennis Court ouse, on SATURDAY, the 7th December, 1844, by illiam Butler, Esq. High Sheriff, pursuant to public quisition, the following Resolutions were proposed by vid J. Wilson, Esq. Belvoir, and unanimously opted :-

Resolved—That a Society be now formed to be called the Clare Agricultural Improvement Society."

Resolved—That its officers shall consist of a Patron, esident, 2 Vice-Presidents, 2 Trustees, a Treasurer, Honorary Secretary, and a paid Assistant Secretary. Resolved-That annual subscriptions, and the intest derivable from donations, shall constitute the funds the society; and that all subscribers of one pound dover thatsum, who may pay in their subscriptions bere the last day of next spring assizes, shall be consired as original members of the society.

Resolved-That a committee of five be now named, to me rules and regulations for the future government the society, and which shall be submitted to a gene-

meeting, to be called for the purpose.

Resolved-That our formation and intention to put rselves in connection with it, be now communicated the Royal Agricultural Improvement Society of eland.

Resolved-That the chief object of this " the County rent Society" shall be to encourage the formation of strict Societies throughout the county, to afford em aid and assistance in carrying out an improved stem of cultivation and cropping on small farms, in usefeeding, in the breeding of cattle suited to the veral localities, and improving the state and domestic onomy of the dwellings of small farmers and laborers. Resolved-That when our funds admit, it would be ost desirable to establish a model farm in the vicinity Ennis; in the meantime we would strongly recomend that proprietors should attach a small portion of ound to schools of every denomination, where boys ght work for a short period each, day, and receive me instruction in the principles of agriculture.

Resolved-That one General Meeting of the Society all take place annually at Ennis, for the exhibition of e stock, farming Implements, Seed, and all kinds of ricultural produce. When honorary premiums, and rtificates, will be awarded to Proprietors and holders large Farms, it being distinctly understood, that all oney, or Implement premiums, shall be reserved for

e occupiers of Farms under 25 acres Irish.

Resolved—That as carrying out the great objects of e Society should cordially bring together, men of ery class and every creed, it be a fundamental rule, at no question of a party, or political tendency, shall introduced at any of the meetings of the Society.
