Belfast has memorialled for a new and commodious Post-office in a central part of the town. Two children were burned to death at Ennis and Ennistymon this week, by their clothes igniting at the fire-place.

A musician named King, having drank a quantity of ardent spirits, died suddenly on Tuesday, at Ennis. At Tomgrany, a man named Brian Mason lost his life from the delapidated state of his house, the loft of which fell in, and crushed him.

John R. Jeffereys, Esq. is appointed manager of the branch of the Provincial Bank opened at Fermoy, this week. Judge Ball has arrived in London, en route to the continent, to join his family.

A most destructive fire broke out on Tuesday night in the extensive Flour Mills of Mr. Power, near Douglas, Cork. Although every exertion that could be made, to stop the progress of the destructive element, it made great head, and in an hour, all that remained of those fine concerns, was a heap of smouldering ruins. The amount of property destroyed is considerable.

On Monday a meeting was called by Sub-Inspector Walker of the Magistrates of the City Cork, when, after deliberation, they came to the decision of awarding a moiety of the fines to the Constabulary in all cases in which they should be prosecutors.

Mr. Austen Shaw, of the London College of Veterinary Surgeons, read a treatise at the Royal Dublin Society house, this week, ascribing the seat of the epidemic distemper, which has destroyed so many horned cattle in Ireland, the last three years, to the lungs; and he was satisfied of its being contagious. The treatment he had found most successful was blood letting, with doses of nauseæ, in tartar of antimony and nitrate of potass, small, but frequent, administered in gruel. No solid food, until recovering.

In *E. Dunne v. J. Preston*, tried in the Exchequer on Wednesday, to recover the amount of a steeple chase stakes at Trim last April, when Norma, rode by Mr. M'Donogh, won, plaintiff contending the mare was disqualified, not being duly entered, there was a verdict against Mr. Preston, £45 damages and 6d. costs. Mr. M'Donogh won three races the same day at Trim!

In the Exchequer, this week, a Cadiz wine company got a verdict for £125 and costs against D Lambert, their late agent in Dublin, for wines consigned to him, and not accounted for.

In the Court of Exchequer a verdict was given of £558 against Earl Charleville, amount of bond due to Mr. Randolph Payne, of London.—The suit was undefended.
