rate. Some of them say, and truly, that they were induced to subscribe to a lawsuit against an alleged monopoly in the market of salmon, but they now find that the real abuse is in quite a different quarter, and which they had never calculated on.

It is therefore earnestly expected that the benevolent citizens of Limerick and its vicinity, who so liberally contributed to establish these valuable schools, will continue their charitable support of them.
