Mr. William Dickson, the second son of the Rev. R.

died in excruciating agony. It is suspected that she  
was hired for this fiendish job, by some parties who  
would profit by the child's death. Verdict of the jury—  
"Wilful murder against Mary Connors," who has  
escaped the vigilance of the police as yet.
