John Walsh, of Manister, returning from this city drunk on Saturday, transferred the halter from his horse's head to his own neck, and suspended himself from a tree on the road near Roxboro', when Constable Ahern fortunately discovered the unfortunate man, and cut him down before life was extinct.

Friday night the house of Robert Goggin, dairyman at Garryallen, near Fedamore, was attacked by an armed party who fired shots and broke the windows, but Goggin held fast the door and prevented their entrance. They told him they wanted money to defend prisoners for trial at the present assizes.

John Crowe was yesterday committed to the County gaol for the abduction of Mary Ryan, widow, in which outrage Morgan Hayes is charged as the principal, and who was this day also apprehended at Ballycahill. The abduction took place at Cluggin.

Thursday night, Constable Thomas Downes and Sub-Constable Fitzpatrick, of the Foynes station in this county, arrested a man who gives his name as Connor Molony, from Kilmichael, county Clare, with two cows in his possession, which he said he purchased at the fair of Nantenant, but which it appears he stole from the Widow Shier, of Robertstown, on the same night. The police were on patrol at the time, and Molony a strong man, made several determined efforts to get away, but to no effect. The prisoner has since admitted his guilt, and is fully committed to gaol by Bourke White, Esq. to stand his trial.

William Tuohy, of Pallasgrean, shoemaker, passing through New Pallas, on Thursday, entered a house on the road side, where he was assaulted by the inmates, and so maltreated that he died soon after. The suspicious nature of the circumstances led to an inquest, but the verdict was—Died by the visitation of God, which finding his friends intend to impeach.

A person has been taken up for the murder of the late Mr. Booth, and has been identified by Mrs. Wm. Bell, who was returning from church on the Sunday, and in sight when the horrid deed was perpetrated.

Chief Baron Brady, dined and slept at Dromoland castle, the seat of Sir Lucius O'Brien, Bart. on Sunday last. His learned and venerable colleague, Judge Burton, attended divine service on Sunday at Ennis church, where the Rev. J. Hastings Allen preached. Their Lordships will pass Sunday next with the Bishop of Killaloe at Clarisford-house.

The Mayor had called by published requisition, a meeting of the citizens at the Exchange, on Monday, at two o'clock, to afford substantial relief to the many sufferers by the fire at Quebec. There were upwards of fifty names to the requisition, including clergymen and town councillors, but up to three o'clock no chair was taken for want of attendance, and the Mayor then dismissed the subject as hopeless. Only three of the requisitionists were present.
