**DEATHS.**

Yesterday, in Catherine-street, in her 22d year, after a long  
and painful illness, which she bore with Christian fortitude,  
Miss Wray, step-daughter to the proprietor of the *Limerick*  
*Reporter*, to the inexpressible grief of her immediate family,  
and the greatest possible regret of all that knew her. She was  
particularly gifted, from the earliest period of her life, with the  
greatest complacency and sweetness of disposition, and tho'  
highly educated and accomplished, was like a lamb in gentle-  
ness and disposition. In her 18th year Miss Wray entered the  
Presentation Convent in this City, and after the usual proba-  
tion was invested with the white veil. Some time after she  
was attacked with loss of appetite and general debility, so that  
her medical attendants had ultimately to recommend her re-  
moval from the Convent about two years since. She was in  
the world again for a few months, during which time she gra-  
dually improved in health. But such was her ardor and zeal  
for a religious life, that when she felt herself better, nothing  
would suffice but to return to the shrine of her affections,  
where she again, in a short time, assumed the holy habit of  
religion and white veil, but the ordeal proved fatal to her.  
After twelve months she was obliged to leave the Convent  
again in March last, being then within one month of her pro-  
fession. Her complaint baffled the first medical and surgical  
skill in Limerick and Dublin. No description could convey any  
idea of the reality of her sufferings although, and of her  
martyr like patience and endurance. Yesterday Sister Mary-  
Magdalene Wray surrendered her pure and spotless spirit into  
the hands of her MAKER. May she rest in peace.—*Communi-  
cated.*
