

at his office in the workhouse at Cashel, on the 31st day of December next; and also so much of said plans, sections, and maps as relates to the said parishes of Clonmel, Kilgrat, Rathronan, Lisronagh, and Newchapel will be deposited with the clerk of the Clonmel poor law union, at his office in the town of Clonmel, on or before the 31st day of December next; and also that a copy of so much of said plans, sections, and books of reference as relates to the parishes of Clonmel, Clonroche, Lickfin, and Ballingarry, will be deposited with the clerk of the Clonmel poor law union at his office in the town of Clonmel, on or before the 31st day of December next; and also that a copy of so much of said plans, sections, and books of reference as relates to the parish of Kilcooly, will be lodged with the clerk of the Thurles poor law union, at his office in the town of Thurles, on or before the 31st day of December next.

It is intended by such act or acts to take power to stop up, whether temporarily or permanently, all turnpike and other roads, railways, aqueducts, bridges, canals, streams, and the aforesaid parishes, townships, town-lands, parochial or other places, or any of them, in which it may be necessary to interfere in the course of the said intended railway or railway works.

It is further intended by such act or acts to extinguish all existing rights or privileges in any manner connected with the lands proposed to be taken, or which would in any manner interfere with the construction, maintenance, or working of the said intended railway, branch railway, or railway works, and to confer other rights and powers in relation to the same.

It is further intended by such act or acts to incorporate a company for the purpose of carrying into effect the said intended railway, branch railway, and other works, and to take powers for the purpose of acquiring lands by compulsion or agreement, for the purpose thereof, and for levying tolls, rates, and duties in respect of the use of the said railway, branch railway, or railway works, and to grant such exemptions, abatements, rates, and duties as to such company.

It is further intended by such act or acts to authorise the Great Southern and Western Railway Company to sell, or let, or transfer that part or parts of the "Great Southern and Western Railway," which is authorised to be made, which extends from near to the said town of Cashel, to or through the town of Thurles, in said county of Tipperary, and all or any powers of such nature as may be necessary in connection therewith, or in relation thereto, to enable the said last mentioned company to carry out the provisions of the said act, or to construct the above-mentioned railway, or any part thereof, so that the said last mentioned railway may form a complete said intended railway from Clonmel to Thurles, and to exercise such powers or any of them, and to contribute funds for or towards the construction, maintenance, and use of the same,
