cause has not been discovered.

On Monday James Bennett, Esq. coroner, held an  
inquest at Barrington's Hospital on the body of Thos.  
Smith, the young man who was killed at the fire, by  
falling into the hold of the Jane, when the jury re-  
turned a verdict in accordance with the testimony of  
Dr. Gelston, that "deceased came to his death by an  
extensive fracture of the skull on the right side, by a  
fall on the head."

The coroner also held an inquest in the same Insti-  
tution on the body of Mary Maher, who was choked  
the previous Saturday night, eating meat. The  
jury found that "death was caused by suffocation,  
owing to a piece of meat having stuck in the throat of  
deceased." It is said the woman was intoxicated.

On Friday an inquest was held at Adare by John Cox,  
Esq. coroner on the body of a new born male infant  
which was discovered in a wood, near that place, the  
preceding day. Drs. Mackey and Peat were examined,  
and performed a post mortem examination on the body  
of the infant. The reputed mother was arrested by  
order of that active officer, Sub-Inspector Channer, and  
committed to take her trial at the next assizes.

Mrs. Mary Goff, who resided on the new Western  
Entrance above the Military road, died suddenly on  
Sunday, when retiring from the Franciscan Chapel,  
where she had been at mass.

Yesterday a sandcot, heavily laden, in charge of John  
Halloran, and Thomas Connell, boatmen, swamped in  
the river, swollen from the high floods, above Park-  
bridge, when Halloran was drowned, and Connell with  
difficulty got safe to shore by laying hold of an oar.

The High Sheriff of Leitrim has applied to the  
Queen's Bench that Edward J. Irwin should be removed  
from his office of Governor of the County gaol, on the  
ground that he had been negligent in the duties of his  
office, and had, by want of caution, allowed two pri-  
soners to escape who had been sentenced to eighteen  
months' imprisonment.

The beautiful estate of Roepark, near Belfast, has
