Captain Carter, of the 1st Royals, is appointed Adjutant of the Monmouthshire Militia, vice Kane, resigned. Lieutenant Walter Ferrier Hamilton, who retired last month from the 83d, has been appointed Adjutant of the Edinburgh Militia, with the rank of Captain.

Mr. now Lt.-Col. Lewis, is to resign the agency of Lord Rossmore's Monaghan estates, and a relative of his lordship, Mr. Cambie, of Tipperary, will assume the management of the property.

John Fitzmaurice, Esq., of Duagh, has been appointed to an Ensigny in the Kerry Militia.

H. M. steamer *Dee*, will be here in a few days from Cork, and bring round meal for this port, if required.

The *Tartarus*, a superior steamer in the Queen's service, will be taken out of dock at Sheerness in a few days, and proceed to the Shannon.

Lord Ellenborough, first Lord of the Admiralty, inspected the ships and dock yard at Portsmouth on Saturday last.

The Hon. Captain Rous, R.N. has succeeded the hon. Captain W. Gordon, resigned, as a junior Lord of the Admiralty.

The following ships are ordered to be brought forward at Chatham for commission:—The *Gloucester*, 50 guns; *Southampton*, 50 guns; and *Isis*, 44 guns: also the *raleigh*, 50 guns, to be commanded by our gallant countryman, Captain Sir Thomas Herbert, K.C.B., who was Midshipman of the *Excellent*, at the defence of *Gaieta* and taking of *Capri*, in 1801; promoted in 809 to Lieutenant, for his services in the *Blonde*, at the capture of the French and Danish islands; Senior lieutenant of the *Euryalus* in the operations in the otomac, including the capture of *Washington* and *Alexandria*, in which he was twice wounded; Commander in 1814; Captain, 1822; and commanded the *Calliope*, in 1839, in the *River Plate*, whence he was ordered to *Hina* in the *Calliope*, and subsequently in command of the *Blenheim*, 72, from October 1840, until February 1842. He commanded a division of the squadron at the king of the *Bocca Tigris*, against *Canton*, in 1841, and assisted in all the operations on the coast of China till the happy conclusion of the war.

Captain Mansel, of the *Acteon*, 26, on the coast of *Trinidad*, is to command at *St. Helena* (which is to be a station,) under the orders of the flag-officer. The *Borneo*, of this port, first of the spring fleet on the *Shannon* for 1846, with emigrants for *North America*, is to sail on the 1st of April next.

Capt. Brand, of the brig, *Airlie*, from *Cork* to *Sligo*, overboard off *Ballycotton*, and perished. The vessel has returned to *Cork*.

The *Tralee* ship canal is at last on the point of being completed. The dam of the seaward end of the Canal taken up, and the second pair of lock gates is put up so that ships are expected to sail up next month.

Dr. A. French, solicitor, was seized with apoplexy *Nenagh* petty sessions on Monday, and was removed from court, since which he is rather better.

A botanical and zoological garden is to be attached to the *Cork* provincial college.

William Cooke, Esq., S.M. is to be stationed in *Tadown*, *Armagh*.

A station consisting of Constable Raymond and six constables, is formed at *Gurtaskea*, near *Roscrea*. The Constable's Guide to his civil powers and duties, by David Duff, Esq. R.M. has just emanated from the press. It appears to be a most requisite vade mecum for the magistrate and constable.

The Tipperary fox hounds meet to-morrow at *Lucan*, and Saturday at *Grove*.

The Ormond and King's county races come off at *Lucan* on the 25th of March, instead of the 24th of April.

Mr. Neilan was on Friday elected drawing master to the *Lucan* Dublin society, in room of Mr. West, who was on a pension.

It appears by the above that the total average circulation of the Bank of Ireland for the period embraced in the return has been less by £45,225 than that for the previous four weeks, while the average amount of Gold and Silver held by the Bank, shows an increase of £21,360 over the last return. The Provincial Bank's circulation has increased by £46,172; while the Bullion held has been less by £3,613. National Bank—Average circulation, less by £10,127; bullion increased by £10,122. Belfast Banking Company—Average circulation, less by £717; bullion increased by £5,454. Northern Bank—Average circulation, less by £6,635; bullion increased by £1,952. Ulster Bank—Average circulation, increased to the amount of £21,955; bullion increased by £2,592. Carrick-on-Suir National Bank—Average circulation, increased by £200; bullion less by £79. Clonmel National Bank—Average circulation, increased by £762; bullion increased by £3,990.
