One of the murderers of the late Laurence Leahy was recognised in Chapel, last Sunday, by the afflicted widow, who fainted at the instant, and the criminal escaped in the confusion.

On Saturday last a fellow armed with a case of pistols entered the dwelling of P. Hanneen, tenant of John Bently, Esq. near Broadford, and threatened his life if he did not give up the land he held.

The house of O'Donoghue, a respectable farmer residing between Bunratty and Newmarket, was attacked on Tuesday night, and two shots fired into it.

The house of Mr. Gunn, clerk of the church at Ogonnelloe, near Killaloe, was attacked on Wednesday night, by an armed party, who broke in, and fired two shots at Gunn, which, in the confusion, he providentially escaped, but they beat him so unmercifully, that he lay for dead, and they carried off his hire-arms.

Michael M'Cormick, baker, of Lock-quay, is fully committed to the city gaol for the wilful murder of his wife, Alice, by striking her on the head with a 2lb. weight. James Bennett, Esq. coroner, held an inquest on the body of deceased, and after the verdict, issued his warrant for committal of the offender.

A man named Lawlor, under agent to Mr. St. George, was fired at on Saturday evening, near Mageny bridge, on the river Barrow. Mr. St. George was previously fired at and wounded, and is to prosecute the assassins at Carlow assizes.

On Sunday night an armed party attacked the house of Mr. D. Cahill, of Rannagh, near Cecilstown, (Kanturk) and demanded his arms. Mr. Cahill refused, when several shots were immediately fired through the doors and windows. Mr. Cahill then handed them a double-barrelled gun, which they carried off. They also took arms from W. Rooney, and M. Connell, in the same neighbourhood. The depredators are supposed to be from the county of Limerick.—*Cork Constitution.*
