

Friday, being the first day of Term, the Court of Bench granted a writ of mandamus at the suit of Daniel Dickson, Esq. to direct the Waterford and Wick Railway Co. to issue their precept to impanel to value the property at Garryglass, in the county of Wick, No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, pursuant to their contract with him. Ejectments have been made by Mr. Dickson, for recovery of his estate at Prior's Land, in this city, and also of his estates at Miltown, in the county Limerick, as unlawfully dispossessed thereof by the Company.

Bill for the divorce of Capt. Creagh, formerly of this city, from his wife (Miss Knolles,) for adultery with Percy Hewgill, a married man, at Boulogne, read a third time in the House of Lords on Wednesday. Capt. Creagh is on half-pay, 29th, and staff of Pensioners at Exeter.

Friday morning a detachment of the 6th Foot, which between Nenagh and Templemore, halted on the bank and piled their arms, when one of their muskets was seized by a country fellow, who made his way up a neighbouring mountain with his prize.

The civil and military officers of Meerut entertained the officers of the 16th Lancers to a banquet, on their arrival there from the Sutlej, and the 57th Regiment embarked on the 14th April, a detachment for England.

The 36th Regiment under Major Trollope, from the 10th of June, has arrived at Manchester, to replace the 10th of June, which has gone to Glasgow. The 69th, and company, has arrived at York, Yorkshire.

The company in the Sligo Militia is vacant by the death of Captain Lindsey. Burr, at the corner of Nenagh, was broken into, and the desk rifled with a silver watch. This money was the property of the poor relief fund, and the consequence is that the works of the committee on several labourers were employed, are given up for the present.

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.—The second spring exhibition of the Limerick Horticultural Society took place in Pery-square, and for splendour, extent, and variety, surpassed any previous exhibition in this city. Two spacious booths were erected for the occasion, beneath which the various plants and flowers, rich, luxuriant, and captivating, were carefully arranged by the competitors, under the superintendence of William Lloyd, Esq. secretary of the Society. The vegetables were much improved, particularly new kidney potatoes sent in by George Tuthill, Esq., and for which an honorary prize was awarded. Six bunches of strawberries were obtained in the garden of William Monsell, Esq., and for which an honorary prize. The judges were, Messrs. Waterford, and Mr. M'Donnell, awarded 22 prizes; Sir Lucius O'Brien's, 5; Lord Clarina's, 5 ditto; Mr. Monsell's, 5; Mr. Bevan's, 13 ditto; Mr. Kelly's (M.P.) 9. The cut flowers and pansies exhibited by Mr. Collopy, gardener to Mr. Eevan, sent in as specimens of cut bloom geraniums, with the "Euphorbia splendens."
